SUBJECT: Official Notification of Final Action on House Bill 25-475, the "San Andreas Abortion Ban Act"

This letter serves as the official confirmation regarding the final action taken by the San Andreas House of Representatives on House Bill 25-475, known as the "San Andreas Abortion Ban Act."

On October 17, 2025, the House formally voted on a Motion to Postpone Indefinitely. This motion, as the most common procedural tool to remove a bill from the legislative process, immediately terminates any further legislative action on the measure.

We are pleased to confirm that the motion was successfully passed by a decisive margin.

The Bill is Defeated and Cannot Be Revived

The passage of the Motion to Postpone Indefinitely means that House Bill 25-475 is officially "killed" for the remainder of this legislative session. The bill has been removed from the legislative process and can no longer proceed.

This outcome is final. No further action can be taken on HB 25-475. The bill, which sought an "unequivocal prohibition" of abortion with "no exceptions", is now officially dead.

This decisive action prevents a measure that was deemed by the House Majority to be overtly and fundamentally unconstitutional from advancing. The bill was considered a violation of the express constitutional protection of reproductive autonomy, including the right to choose, and the constitutional mandate for the state to provide and fund abortion services in cases of rape or incest.

We thank the Representatives who voted affirmatively to uphold the San Andreas Constitution and protect the rights of our citizens.
