24	State and summon the members of the SENATE of the Seventy-Sixth General		
25	Assembly to meet in Special Session at 9:00 a.m., on October 3, 2025, at the State		
26	Capitol, in the City and County of Los Santos, to commence the impeachment trial in		
27	the Senate of Representative Lewis Yates. GIVEN under my hand and the Executive

1 PURSUANT to Article V, Section 6 of the San Andreas Constitution, The Legislature 2 shall have the sole power of impeachment. An impeachment may be initiated by a 3 motion introduced by two members of the House of Representatives and co-sponsored by a Senator. A bill of impeachment must be passed by a vote of no less than fifty-five 4 5 percent (55%) of the House of Representatives. Upon passage, the bill shall be transmitted to the Senate, which shall have the sole power to try all impeachments. The 6 7 grounds for impeachment shall include, but not be limited to, wrongdoing, corruption, 8 bribery, upon a criminal conviction or indictment, or other unethical behavior. A 9 conviction on impeachment requires the concurrence of no less than sixty-five percent (65%) of the entire Senate. A judgment in cases of impeachment shall not extend further 10 11 than removal from office and disqualification from holding any office of honor, trust, or 12 profit under the State of San Andreas. 13 14 IT IS DECLARED that the House of Representatives has met the constitutional burden 15 to APPROVE and ADOPT the following Articles of Impeachment against 16 Representative Lewis Yates: **17** 18 ARTICLE I: Criminal Charges relating to Violence and Abuse 19 ARTICLE II: Conduct unbecoming of an elected official 20 21 THEREFORE, the Senate of the Seventy-Sixth Session shall CONVENE to hold a trial 22 on this matter and ADJOURN when the trial has been completed, and all present 23 senators have voted on this resolution. 24 25 9:10 a.m. THE PRESIDENT has read all constitutional provisions applicable to this 26 matter before the Senate. 27 28 9:19 a.m. THE CLERK has read all impeachment articles to senators. 29 **30** 9:24 a.m. THE PRESIDENT opened up the floor for debate. 31 32 9:26 a.m The attorney for Representative Yates, Jon Sherlov began his first speech. 33 34 10:01 a.m. SENATOR STEINBECK began her first speech. **35** 36 10:37 a.m. SENATOR CHO began his first speech. **37** 38 11:10 a.m. SENATOR MURILLO began her first speech. **39** 40 11:55 a.m. HOUSE IMPEACHMENT MANAGER ROBERTS began her first speech.
